Development & Behavioral Health



Our Developmental-behavioral pediatrician understands that children's development and behavior happen first and foremost in the context of the family, seeking to understand the family's view of the problem and the effect of the child's problem on the family. Our Developmental-behavioral pediatrician advocates for their patients with developmental and behavioral problems by working closely with schools, preschools, and other agencies involved with developmental care and education. Here, we evaluate your child's strengths and challenges and work with you to develop a care plan for your child's ongoing developmental, behavioral, and learning successes.

We also help you understand how to access to special education services (speech, occupational, developmental, physical therapies), tutoring, and family support services through early intervention or special education programs, depending on your child's age. We monitor the development of children with complex challenges over time so they have measurable successes developmentally, educationally, and socially. Medical consultations and follow-up care are provided at the Developmental-Behavioral Pediatric Program at Brookdale University Hospital.
